A guide for Parents and Guardians

What is SAP?

SAP is a collaborative team of trained school district and county agency personnel who meet regularly to identify students needs and provide support in removing barriers to learning. The SAP team does not diagnose or treat students, but can provide information and guidance to students and families to obtain school and community resources, supports, and services.

How are students referred to the SAP team?

Anyone who has observed behavior that is concerning and poses a barrier to student's learning and success, may complete and submit a referral to the SAP team. Referrals can be made by school staff, students, family members, community members and students themselves by completing the SAP referral form link which can be found on each building website under the school counselor/guidance tab.

What happens once a referral is made?

Once a referral is submitted, the SAP team will obtain information about the student's behavior from the adults that interact regularly with the student.

A SAP team member will contact the student's parent/guardian to review this information and obtain permission to proceed with the SAP process. With parent/guardian consent, the SAP team will collaborate with the parent/guardian to develop a plan to help the child succeed. As the parent/guardian, YOU are a very important part of the team because you know your child best!

- ⇒ DEFYING AUTHORITY

- ⇒ TALKING ABOUT SELF-HARM
- ⇒ DISCIPLINARY AND BEHAVIOR PROBLEMS
- ⇒ LYING
- ⇒ ACADEMIC DECLINE
- ⇒ SIGNIFICANT WEIGHT LOSS OR GAIN
- ⇒ TRUANCY
- ⇒ NEEDING MONEY WITHOUT A GOOD EXPLANATION
